- increase in daily physical activity for students
- decrease in traffic congestion in school zones, which leads to...
 - a decrease in emissions in school zones
 - an increase in road safety
- more informed school community

- AST creates safer, healthier communities (more eyes on the street, more parents/families walking or cycling)



The Active School Travel Process



Setting Up a Successful AST Project:

Community Collaborators and Champions

- municipal Traffic/Transportation and Active Transportation department
- police services
- local pedestrian and cycle safety groups (AMA, local cycle shops, CAN Bike, etc)
- community councils
- Schools: champion administrators, staff, parent council members, and students
- Educational resources (community or online)

- *Family Travel Survey
- *Classroom Hands Up Survey
- *Traffic Count
- Traffic Observations
- *Walkabout/Environmental Scan
- Pedometer Study
- Air quality testing (Air Beam)







Creating a School Action Plan

 - Education, Engineering, Enforcement, Encouragement, and Evalutation

Action Plan Implementation Evaluation

Follow-up data collection:

- Family travel survey (quantitative and qualitative)
- Classroom hands-up survey
- Traffic Counts
- Pedometer Study
- Air quality testing

Compare with baseline data collection
